



## BACKGROUND

1. There may be a conflict between a party's political platform and the party's policies voted on by its members at policy conventions. This is because under the Canadian political party system, the party leaders are not obliged to follow policy positions agreed to by the membership at policy conventions.

The exception to this is the NDP, where, technically, the leader is supposed to follow party policy voted on by its members. In practice, however, this does not always occur.

2. The People's Party, led by MP Maxime Bernier (Beauce, PQ) "does not have official positions on any social issue" but welcomes candidates who would "submit private members bills on any issue, including abortion". Party leader Bernier is not personally pro-life, however, the party will accept the nominations of pro-life candidates to represent the party.

3. This pamphlet was compiled in August 2019, two months prior to the federal election on October 21, 2019. The early release of this pamphlet was necessary due to the requirement that it be included in a hard copy of REALity. The August issue is the last hard copy printed prior to the election. To delay the pamphlet for inclusion in the next hard copy issue (October) may result in its postal delivery after the election is over.

It is possible that there may be changes in policy and/or more details provided or even a reversal in policies during the election campaign.

4. A ballot marked "No Suitable Candidate" is rejected by Elections Canada as is a ballot left blank or defaced. There is no way of knowing what the voter's intent was in failing to mark the ballot properly for one candidate. As a result, it is not helpful to mark your ballot in that manner.

The 2019 election is a turning point in Canadian history. It will determine whether Canada will continue to be an anti-life/family, materialistic, secular state, or will return to more traditional values on which Canada's laws have been previously based, and on which this nation has flourished.

It will be unfortunate if a Liberal government is returned to power in October, or even worse if there should be a Liberal / Green Party / NDP Coalition.
